Expressed Power

- Powers specifically granted exclusively to the national government
- © Constitution list 17 specific powers
- **Examples:**
 - coin money
 - set up postal system
 - declare war

- regulate interstate/ foreign trade
- make treaties
- regulate immigration

^{*}national gov = federal gov

Concurrent Power

- Powers shared between national & state government

Examples:

- levy/collect taxes
- guarantee civil rights & liberties
- provide public safety
- protect public health
- establish courts
- punish law breakers
- borrow \$\$
- construct/maintain roads



RESERVED POWER



- Powers reserved by the state
- © Constitution says little about this power

Examples:

- conduct election
- established local gov
- establish schools
- regulate marriage/divorce/adoption
- regulate intrastate trade
- fire/police protection
- **licensing**
