- Other words for it are Iwa ji, Iri ji or Ike ji, which means new-yam eating

#### What does it symbolize?


Wealth and prosperity

#### What is the kola nut?

- It's a fruit that is grown on the western part of Nigeria
- The kola nut has a very deep meaning

- ► The Igbos say that the "Kola is life" and that the Kola symbolizes peace.

- Used to welcome visitors to a village
- Used during a big ceremony or festival

### Igbo Weddings

- Igbo wedding is usually a large family
- The father of bride and groom are very much involved in finalizing the marriage proposal
- The tradition involves the groom's family to pay a price for the bride and all this is negotiated as part of the process.
- The payment is done in Kola nuts, chickens, goats etc.
- During the wedding day, the bride would have to find her husband while being distracted by the guest.
- Once she has found him and he drinks the wine from the cup presented by the bride then they are considered officially married.
